

Early intervention programs are accountable for child and family outcomes best achieved by providers whose practices align with current research. Consider these five ways of ensuring providers are well-aligned with evidence-based early intervention practices.

- 1. Establish contractual expectations for provider fidelity to evidence-based practices.
- Use an observation tool that focuses on early intervention-specific practices (e.g., FIP-EI).
- Use the aggregated observation data to determine where your professional development priorities lie.
- 4. Ensure your professional development initiatives include follow-up coaching using a capacity-building framework that supports knowledge-to-practice.
- 5. Invest in a "fidelity-to-practice" infrastructure to ensure every provider has a mentor coach and every mentor coach has a fidelity coach.
