Monitoring in the age of tele-intervention is challenging. As you adjust to managing a team of early childhood intervention practitioners providing services remotely, make sure you have systems and processes for monitoring the interdependent aspects of their work.

The Practices



How are practitioners translating evidence-based practices to virtual visits?

Consider:

- real-time or video observations.
- regular supervision meetings to discuss intervention.
- communities of practice to discuss successes and challenges.

Teaming, Communication, and Collaboration



How sufficiently are practitioners documenting?

Consider:

- streamlining the flow of paperwork.
- monitoring paperwork
- closely.
 directly supporting team members who need
- having team members support one another.

Monitor Practitioner Competence with:

How will teammates collaborate with one another?

Consider:

- scheduling regular team meetings.
- virtual office hours to connect with one another.
- having team members support one another.
- investigating features of your virtual meeting platform that allow for easy teaming, hanging out, and collaboration.

Documentation and Paperwork How well is the technology working?

Consider:

- determining how well practitioners are learning the technical aspects of using the platform.
- asking caregivers how they perceive the technology (as an opportunity or a barrier).
