Umm, so other things that they do. They have a team of providers. So, this was really key for my family and I because we started off just receiving speech therapy. My kid because he couldn't communicate and there was this great language barrier, he uh, started having some behavior issues. And, our person through FIPP was able to go back to her team and say hey guys were having issues with this little boy. What can we do? You don't have access to just speech therapy, but you have access to all these other supports and resources.

Speaking of Resources, FIPP can also provide you with help in other areas to make your life easier. For me, we were in a daycare where they were calling us every day. They were pulling me out of work. My job became on the line. Through that process FIPP helped me find the exact right fit for my child and my family.
